

DOZER DAY 2021 COVID 19 SAFETY PROTOCOLS

Additional Signage

- The attached PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 poster provided by Panhandle Public Health shall be posted at all points of entry to the event as well as throughout the event site

Social Distancing

- All persons, including volunteers, attendees, and vendors should remain at least six feet apart to the greatest extent possible
- Provide signage for safe social distancing
- Provide face coverings or masks for all volunteers & attendees
- If deemed necessary, conduct health checks such as temperature screening and/or symptom checking of staff and attendees safely and respectfully, and in accordance with any applicable privacy laws and regulations.
- Temperature scan checks upon entry for all attendees

Hygiene Protocols

- Provide additional hand washing stations throughout the event
- Encourage frequent hand washing by volunteers and adequate supplies to do so
- Provide regular sanitization of high touch areas, such as workstations, equipment, screens, doorknobs, restrooms throughout work site

Staffing and Operations

- Provide training for volunteers regarding COVID-19 safety which includes at least:
 - Signs and symptoms of COVID-19;
 - Risk of asymptomatic spread of COVID-19;
- Ensure volunteers who are displaying COVID19-like symptoms do not report to work
- Avoid offering any self-serve food or drink options, such as buffets, salad bars, and drink stations. Provide pre-packaged boxes or bags for each attendee.
- Rapid COVID tests administered for all volunteer operators having direct contact with children

- If a staff member or attendee becomes sick at your event, separate them from others as soon as possible and until they can go home. Provide them with clean, disposable face masks to wear, if available. If not available, provide them with a cloth face covering, which can be improvised if needed from a tee shirt, bandana or other clothing, as well as a tissue or some other way to cover their coughs and sneezes. If needed, contact emergency services for those who need emergency care. Public transportation, shared rides, and taxis should be avoided for sick persons. Be sure to contact local public health officials regarding the possible case of COVID-19 at your event and how to communicate with staff and attendees about possible exposure to the virus.

Cleaning and Disinfecting

- Establish and maintain cleaning protocols specific to the event
- Disinfection of all common surfaces must take place at intervals appropriate to said workplace
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces within the venue at least daily or between uses as much as possible—for example, door handles, sink handles, drinking fountains, grab bars, hand railings, and cash registers.
- Clean and disinfect shared objects between uses—for example, payment terminals, tables, countertops, bars, and condiment holders.
- Ensure safe and correct use and storage of cleaners and disinfectants to avoid harm to employees and other individuals. Always read and follow label instructions for each product, and store products securely away from children.
- Choose the right disinfectant for your surface from EPA's List N: Disinfectants for Coronavirus (COVID-19). Cleaning products should not be used near children. Staff should ensure that there is adequate ventilation when using these products to prevent attendees or themselves from inhaling toxic vapors.
- Use disposable gloves when removing garbage bags or handling and disposing of trash. After using disposable gloves, throw them out in a lined trash can. Do not disinfect or reuse the gloves. Wash hands after removing gloves.
